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## Hard-to-Match Comparables from Last Year Will Slow Down Box Office Momentum in Third Quarter of 2025

When the second quarter of 2025 began on Friday, April 4th, cinemas were coming off their weakest quarterly performance in the post-pandemic period. The thirteen weeks from January to March grossed only \$1.370B, 13% lower than Q1 in 2024.

Thankfully, Warner Bros.' A MINECRAFT MOVIE stepped into the breach with a \$163M opening weekend, better than anyone had expected, and the second quarter was off to the races. After the Q2 2024 and the first half of 2025, MINECRAFT went on to earn \$424M domestic and \$955M worldwide, helping the second quarter of 2025 become 136% of the second quarter of 2024. That allowed the first half to finish at 114% compared with the first half of 2024. The first quarter's gloom was washed away by the second quarter's sunny skies.

Now as we look ahead to the third quarter, the big question will be whether Q2's momentum will continue. So far, so good with July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend starting with a bang. Universal's JURASSIC WORLD: REBIRTH opened on Wednesday July 2<sup>nd</sup> followed by next weekend's arrival of Warner Bros.' SUPERMAN on July 11<sup>th</sup>. These two pictures will be the top movies of the quarter, teaming up to earn an estimated \$670M during the quarter. While there are many other interesting titles to fill out the picture, we do not see any other films with as much box office potential.

Last year Q3 also started strong, with the July 3<sup>rd</sup> opening of Universal's DESPICABLE ME 4. In fact, Universal seems to have set its sights on the Independence Day holiday, having the leading movie of the holiday weekend for five out of six years starting in 2021. F9: THE FAST SAGA (\$70M in 2021), MINIONS: THE RISE OF GRU (\$107M in 2022), DESPICABLE ME 4 (\$75M in 2024), JURASSIC WORLD: REBIRTH (\$XXM in 2025) and MINIONS 3 (opening July 1, 2026). The studio is either a true believer in the strength of the mid-year holiday or they are very patriotic... or both!

When evaluating the prospects for an upcoming quarter, it is always helpful to look back to the movies that played during the matching quarter from the year before. The best place to begin is by comparing the estimated top ten grossing pictures of the upcoming quarter to the actual top ten pictures from the quarter one year ago. Here is how that comparison looks for this year's Q3.

As with many things in life, timing is everything. In 2024, four of the top eight movies of the year were released in the third quarter between July 5<sup>th</sup> and September 6<sup>th</sup>. After what had been an underwhelming first two quarters of the year, they gave the 2024 box office a much needed and welcome boost. However, the flip side of that coin is that Q3 this year may have a hard time matching last year's success.

**TOP FOUR FILMS 3RD QUARTER 2025 VS. 3RD QUARTER 2024**

On the one hand, the firepower from last year's top four movies of the third quarter will be tough to match. We expect that the top four movies in last year's Q3 will beat this year's top four movies of the quarter by almost \$600M. On the other hand, this year's third quarter will begin with two of the biggest movies of the year: Universal's JURASSIC WORLD: REBIRTH and Warner Bros.' SUPERMAN. These two films will be critical to the overall results for the third quarter.

Last year, Disney and Marvel's DEADPOOL & WOLVERINE opened on July 26<sup>th</sup>, enjoyed a massive \$211.4M opening weekend, grossed \$632M within the quarter and \$636.7M overall which made it the highest grossing R-rated movie of all time.

When a studio sets their release schedule, they can determine the performance of a quarter single handedly. Had Disney decided to swap the opening dates for last year's KINGDOM OF THE PLANET OF THE APES and DEADPOOL & WOLVERINE, which was a distinct possibility, it would have changed the outcome of the two quarters dramatically. KINGDOM opened on May 10<sup>th</sup> and earned \$171M within the second quarter, while D&W opened on July 26<sup>th</sup> and earned \$632M within the third quarter. In other words, swapping those movies and release dates would have shifted \$461M from the third quarter into the second quarter. If that had happened, the enhanced second quarter of 2024 would have come close to matching the excellent second quarter of 2025. And the diminished third quarter of 2024 would have been similar to what we expect to see in the third quarter of 2025.

## TOTAL NUMBER OF WIDE RELEASES

The pace of new movie releases continues to be strong. While exhibition would always want to have more movies to play, it has benefitted from all distributors being active with their release schedule, from the major studios with their blockbusters to the independents with their variety of eclectic titles. Virtually ever week, moviegoers have a full slate to choose from when they head out to the theatre. During the third quarter of 2025, we expect to see 30 wide release movies, defined as any movie which plays at a minimum of 1000 theatres across the U.S. and Canada. This compares with 31 wide release movies that opened in the third quarter of 2024.



## WARNER BROS. WILL DOMINATE THE THIRD QUARTER, TAKING THE LEAD THROUGH THE FIRST 39 WEEKS


After two quarters in which Disney led all other studios in box office earnings, Warner Bros. will take the lead in the third quarter and for the year-to-date. It will benefit from the box office of new openers SUPERMAN (7/11), WEAPONS (8/8), THE CONJURING: LAST RIGHTS (9/5), ONE BATTLE AFTER ANOTHER (9/26) and some carry over sales from F-1: THE MOVIE (6/27). We are estimating WB's quarterly box office to be \$635M, which would amount to a 27% market share for the quarter and 24% for the first nine months of the year. Universal will finish in second place for the quarter with approximately \$360M coming from titles that include JURASSIC WORLD: REBIRTH (7/2), BAD GUYS 2 (8/1), NOBODY 2 (8/15), HIM (9/19) and GABBY'S DOLLHOUSE (9/26). Disney will finish in third place as it only has two new movies in the quarter, THE FANTASTIC 4: FIRST STEPS (7/25) and FREAKIER FRIDAY (8/8). Those two should produce around \$340M in the quarter, giving them a 22% market share for the year as of that point. However, when 2025 is complete, Disney will finish as the annual box office winner, since they have a very strong slate of Q4 releases including TRON: ARES (10/10), PREDATOR: BADLANDS (11/7), ZOOTOPIA 2 (11/26) and AVATAR: FIRE AND ASH (12/19). As of this point, Warner Bros. has only MORTAL KOMBAT II (10/24) on its release schedule for Q4. We expect that WB will wind up second on the annual list, with Universal coming in third.

Starring Scarlett Johansson, Jonathan Bailey and Rupert Friend, five years post-JURASSIC WORLD: DOMINION (2022), an expedition braves isolated equatorial regions to extract DNA from three massive prehistoric creatures for a groundbreaking medical breakthrough.

**SUPERMAN** (Warner Bros., \$425M-\$450M Q3)

PG-13 | Action, Adventure, Fantasy, Sci-Fi

Superman must reconcile his alien Kryptonian heritage with his human upbringing as reporter Clark Kent (David Corenswet). As the embodiment of truth, justice and the human way he soon finds himself in a world that views these as old-fashioned. Rachel Brosnahan stars as Lois Lane and Nicholas Hoult as Lex Luthor. James Gunn directs this much-anticipated summer adventure.

**THE FANTASTIC FOUR: FIRST STEPS** (Disney, \$225M-\$250M Q3)


Action, Adventure, Sci-Fi

**TOGETHER** (NEON, \$12M-\$15M Q3)

Years into their relationship, Tim (Dave Franco) and Millie (Alison Brie) find themselves at a crossroads as they move to the country. With tensions already flaring, an encounter with an unnatural force threatens to corrupt their lives, their love and their flesh.





**THE STRANGERS: CHAPTER 2** (Lionsgate, \$21M-\$26M Q3 | \$40M-\$45M Total)

## CONCLUSION

After a bountiful second quarter, this year's Q3 will struggle to match up with last year's powerful lineup in the same period. We are estimating that the top four films of this year's Q3 will earn around \$600M less than last year's top four. It is often the case that last year's successes will come back to haunt the current year, at least by comparison.

All told, we expect Q3 of 2025 to produce 91% of the box office of Q3 of 2024. Whereas the quarter began with a 26-week year-over-year comparison at 115%, the quarter will end with that benchmark standing at 105%. This will set up a close race to finish out the year. The fourth quarter of 2024 was stocked with high-grossing movie releases such as UNIVERSAL's WICKED and Disney's MOANA 2 that will be challenging to compete with. However, this year's Q4 releases also look promising, especially Universal's WICKED FOR GOOD and Disney's AVATAR: FIRE AND ASH. We feel comfortable that full year of 2025 will wind up with a slight increase over 2024 results. While the final tally may be closer than some would have hoped for, we encourage everyone to remember the disappointing start to the year, with a first quarter that was the worst of the post-pandemic period, and 13% lower than Q1 of 2024. Everyone should be cheered by the very strong recovery in Q2 followed by good, consistent performance throughout the second half of the year.
